This week, UCSF Health has seen improvement in hospitalized cases of COVID19 positive patients. Currently, San Francisco remains at Level 4 High Alert with 34.4 new cases daily per 100,000 population. This is equal to about 299 new cases daily in San Francisco.

What guidance is available for employee post vaccine symptoms and return to work?

The guidance has been updated this week.

PURPOSE: to allow some employees with typical post-vaccine symptoms that overlap with COVID-19 to return to work more quickly. These recommendations reflect that post-vaccine dose #2 is showing more frequent fever, but also being post-vaccine dose #1 provides some protection.

CHANGES:

- 1. <u>Post-Vaccine Dose #1</u>: if mild-moderate muscle aches, headache, fatigue or joint aches, then continue to work if duration < 48 hours. Any exposure to COVID-19 confirmed persons during previous 14 days warrants discussion with OHS staff and clearance.
 - a. If duration < 48 hours, then continue/return to work with no testing.
 - b. If duration > 48 hours, then proceed with calling OHS Hotline, COVID testing and standard Return to Work.
 - c. If duration < 48 hours, but includes fever or other COVID-specific symptoms, then proceed with calling OHS Hotline, COVID testing and standard Return to Work.
- 2. <u>Post-Vaccine Dose #2</u>: if mild-moderate muscle aches, headache, fatigue or joint aches, AND/OR fever (>100F/37.8C) *AND no recent exposure to COVID-19 confirmed persons during previous 14 days*
 - a. If duration <48 hours, then return to work when fever-free x 24 hrs. Call COVID Hotline for clearance. COVID testing optional. Obtain COVID test through Color or COVID Hotline.

- b. If duration > 48 hrs, then proceed with calling OHS Hotline, COVID testing and standard Return to Work (fever-free > 72 hrs, etc).
- a. If duration < 48 hours, but includes other COVID-specific symptoms, then proceed with calling OHS Hotline, COVID testing and standard Return to Work.
