Per the California Health and Human Services Agency, Department of Developmental Services, populations with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities are at high risk of COVID-19 complications and related fatalities. They issued a letter to clarify that family members of certain people are “health care workers” pursuant to the State of California’s Vaccination Plan (<https://covid19.ca.gov/vaccines/#When-can-I-get-vaccinated>), and thus are prioritized for COVID-19 vaccination within Phase 1A.

In order to receive a vaccine a letter from your local regional center or from a provider that documents your family member's diagnosis from one of the following conditions is needed:

- Cerebral Palsy
- Epilepsy
- Down Syndrome
- Specialized health care needs, including dependence upon ventilators, oxygen, and other technology
